

Fourteen 'Lost' Fliers Held as War Prisoners

Ottawa, May 8 (CP). — Six men were reported killed on active service overseas and three missing after overseas air operations in today's Royal Canadian Air Force casualty list, 259th of the war.

Four men previously reported missing overseas were listed now for official purposes presumed dead.

Fourteen previously reported missing overseas were reported to be prisoners of war, and one man was listed as seriously injured on active service overseas.

Toronto Flier Safe.

Mr. and Mrs. E. C. Pringle, 16 Blythwood Road, yesterday were informed by the Air Ministry that their son, Sergeant Observer John E. C. Pringle, R.C.A.F., who was reported missing after air operations on April 12, was a prisoner of war. The information was secured by the International Red Cross which quoted German sources and unofficial information stated that he had been shot down and taken prisoner in occupied territory. Sergeant Pringle proceeded overseas last November and was with the 418th Bomber Squadron.
